7<sup>th</sup> June 1797. of Ord. 1796. to wit.

This Indenture made the sixth day of May anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and ninety six Between  
Peter Otto of the County of Frederick and State of Maryland of the one part; and Paul Hawke of the County of  
Frederick and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Peter Otto for and in consideration of  
the sum of twenty one pounds five shillings current money to him in hand paid and before the making and  
delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Peter Otto doth hereby acknowledge and himself here  
with to be fully satisfied contented and paid hath given granted bargained sold aliened released conveyed  
and confirmed, and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien release convey and confirm unto  
the said Paul Hawke his Heir Executors Administrators and Assigns All that part of a tract of land called  
Long Snake lying in the County aforesaid Beginning at the end of fifty perches and a half perch  
on the eighth line of said tract and running with it South fifty degrees West forty five and one half  
perches South thirteen perches South four degrees West twenty six perches to the end of the twenty  
third line of said land then with it North seventy degrees West twenty perches North fifty five  
perches North fifty degrees East forty two perches to the middle of the Main Road that leads  
through the said Paul Hawke's land then by a straight line to the Beginning containing  
fourteen and one quarter Acres of land more or less Together with all Rights Profits Benefits  
and Advantages to the same belonging or in anywise appertaining To have and to hold  
the said Tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances unto the said Paul Hawke his Heir  
Executors Administrators and Assigns forever - And the said Peter Otto for himself his  
Heir Executors and Administrators doth warrant grant promise and agree to and with  
the said Paul Hawke his Heir Executors Administrators and Assigns that the said Peter  
Otto his Heir Executors and Administrators the said parcel of land with the appurtenances  
unto the said Paul Hawke his Heir Executors and Administrators as well against the  
said Peter Otto as against all persons claiming by from or under the said Peter Otto  
shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. In Witness whereof the said Peter  
Otto hath hereunto set his Hand and Seal the day and year first above written

Frederick County to wit On the sixth day of May 1796. came Peter Otto the grantor named in  
the above Instrument of Writing before the subscribers two of the Justices of the peace for the said  
County and acknowledged the same to be his Act and deed and the lands and premises therein  
mentioned to be the right and Estate of the said Paul Hawke his Heir and Assigns forever according  
to the true Intent and Meaning of the said deed and the Act of Assembly in such cases made At the  
same time came Anna Wife of the said Peter Otto and relinquished her Right of Dower in the lands  
and premises above mentioned to the said Paul Hawke his Heir and Assigns she being by us examined apart  
from and out of the Hearing of her said Husband declared that she made such relinquishment of her  
own free and voluntary Consent and that she was not induced thereto by Force or the fear of incurring
